Interclub Tournaments

Auckland/Northland region Interclub competition started in March – our club has 2 Intermediate Teams and 1 Junior team. These sessions are online on a Friday evening once a month. We have had some great results in the last 2 rounds particularly in the Intermediates. In April, Dianne Knight and Jeanette Grimmer were the second highest pair (out of 28) followed closely by David and Celia Knighton who were third. In May, Ian and Lynley Lewington were the second pair and Warkworth Mahu (Dianne Knight, Jeanette Grimmer, Ian and Lynley Lewington with guest appearance by Steve Moore) is currently sitting top of the ladder of 14 teams. The next round is on June 27th.



Monday Session

We are delighted to celebrate the achievements of our club members who have recently earned their Certificate of Proficiency. This certification represents their dedication to mastering the complexities of the game. The top placegetters on all sessions earn "C" Masterpoints which are shown on the results for the session. Totals for any individual can be viewed on the NZ Bridge website once you have a login. Contact Sarah to get a login (– this is a new system for NZ Bridge). 100 C points convert to one "B" point. You need five B points to earn your Certificate of Proficiency. NZ Bridge send out certificates at the end of each quarter – so please be patient.



The three week Drawn Pairs Handicap Competition kicked off on May 19th with 9.5 tables. Intermediate players and those with Certificate of Proficiency (mostly) drew other novice (beginner) players. Drawn pairs is a fun way of matching up players and most partnerships had not played together before. A couple of spot prizes, donated by Kathryn, added to the fun for the evening. We would especially like to thank all Intermediate players who are assisting Novice players improve their skills on these sessions. Remember, it's not just about winning, it's about growing as a player and enjoying the journey.

Tournaments

Eight of our members have played in tournaments since March: Hibiscus Coast, Howick, Auckland, East Coast Bays, Franklin, Cambridge, and online Regional Trials. Rex Manning- Voyce played in his first tournament and other players were Alan and Jan France, Steve Moore. Ross Longney, Graeme Duhs, Caroline Goodall and Murray Jurgeleit. Notable performances were at Auckland Club's Easter Pairs where 24 pairs played with Steve and Ross coming second, and Graeme and Sue Jury (ECB) coming third; at Howick where Ross and Graeme won the Intermediate section out of 19 pairs; and at Franklin where Ross and Murray came 4th. Most members wear Warkworth Club badges which generate discussion and interest with players from other clubs.

Regular play in tournaments generate friendships and contacts with players from other clubs and matches are played in a friendly atmosphere. Directors are called to rule on any points and whether player discussions have conveyed information between partners. For example, one night a guy was playing with his future wife, and they had been playing several rounds with poor boards. She said, "It is going to be a long night". An opponent asked the guy how he interpreted her comments. He said "invitational".
