#### **Thursday Social Sessions**

Kathryn is hosting Thursday evening Bridge sessions at the clubrooms from 7pm. All welcome. "A gold coin Koha" covers the power etc. No need to book. No formal end time. The format is relaxed, casual, and social session with no computer scoring and occasionally with coffee & cake. Played boards from other sessions are replayed, or (with prior arrangement) the boards from any Beginner or Intermediate lesson or a special set of 28 boards that will test your Stayman and Transfer skills. Or you can set up your own challenges to practice. Short tips are given and sometimes a recap of bidding guidelines taught in the lessons. Usually, the Board selected for discussion is from Monday night, but recently the Tip was on a Wednesday night competitive board.

Those attending have stated the sessions:

- are relaxed, fun and enjoyable
- are providing more opportunities to learn
- have increased player confidence
- have kept engagement levels high

Currently those attending are 2023 and 2024 Beginners but all members are welcome to attend.

#### **Tournaments**

Several of our members have played in 11 tournaments from the end of March to end August. Graeme Duhs has played in 9; Steve Moore 7; Ross Longney 4; Alan and Jan France 3; and Richard Norburn 1. Playing in tournaments shows keenness to challenge oneself against others in the same grade and helps to improve one's play.

They are friendly events where we meet keen players from other clubs and three of our members above have played tournaments with partners from other clubs - met as a result of playing in earlier tournaments.

In addition to the Intermediate grade, there are also Junior grade tournaments. Any keen Junior members should consider playing in Junior tournaments to get more practice and to improve their play. Just ask any of the above if you would like to find out more about playing in tournaments. The major bridge event coming up at end September is the annual National Congress open to all players in each grade. We have a few members entered for Congress (held at Mt Maunganui) and there is still time to enter if you want to experience this major NZ Bridge event.

#### **Warkworth Annual Tournament**

An Officer of the New Zealand Order of Merit: **Sarah Haydon** For services to people with disabilities

Mrs Sarah Haydon has contributed to the leadership and ongoing modernisation of New Zealand Riding for the Disabled (NZRDA) for 30 years.

Mrs Haydon developed, implemented and trained a comprehensive Health and Safety Management System for NZRDA, and developed the Annual Operational Certificate and independent review process to demonstrate ongoing compliance, critical for the safety of riders, staff and volunteers for groups who deliver programmes to more than 3,500 riders. She began as a side walker and horse leader with Riding for Disabled (RDA) Auckland Central and served on the committee for 22 years as a treasurer and secretary. She has been a member of the National NZRDA Standards, Certification and Learning team for more than 15 years. She created overarching frameworks supported by policies, substantial training material and guidance, also supporting many RDA Groups with governance and strategic planning advice. This work helped RDA remain an internationally recognised therapeutic horse-riding programme. She served as a Board member and Chair of NZRDA from 2011 to 2020, during which she transformed the not-for-profit organisation to more effectively support the 49 groups nationwide, and more than 3,000 volunteers and staff. Mrs Haydon was made a Life Member of NZRDA in 2020 and of Auckland Central RDA in 2006.

#### **Loveblock NZ Wide Pairs**
