#### **Interprovincial Championships**

The Interprovincial Championships were held over the weekend November 18-20. The 7 provinces of NZ all competed on the Real Bridge platform in 4 grades: Open, Senior, Women, and Intermediate. Trials were held in May 2022 to select teams for the Auckland/Northland region with 3 pairs selected for each grade and Steve Moore and Graeme Duhs were selected for the Intermediate grade. The other two pairs for Intermediate both came from Whangarei club – so no pairs from Auckland clubs were selected. Competition was strong with each pair playing about 96 boards over the weekend.

Auckland/Northland Open and Women's teams came 1<sup>st</sup>; Seniors came 5<sup>th</sup>; and unfortunately, the Intermediates came 7<sup>th</sup>. Steve and Graeme both enjoyed playing in the championships with Sunday night practices and coaching on a regular basis leading up to the competition weekend. – Thanks Graeme for this report.

### **Demystifying Masterpoints**

Have you ever wondered what the points are on the club bridge results and what their purpose is? Thanks Jan for the explanation below:

'C' points are part of the NZ Bridge rating system called 'Masterpoints' used for ranking players. Warkworth Bridge Club is a NZ Bridge affiliated club and as such we award Masterpoints at each session. As a member of Warkworth Bridge Club you are affiliated to NZ Bridge and part of a wider Bridge community regionally, national and internationally.

'C' points are awarded to the winners and placegetters. If a Mitchell movement is played, you stay either East/West or North/ South for the whole session. Points are awarded to both the winners and place getters North/South and East/West Pairs. If it is a Howell movement, points are awarded to the winners and placegetters on a single ladder.

So, what do they mean? NZB has 3 levels of players based on NZB Points, Junior, Intermediate and Open and they have tournaments for each of these levels. Points are used by NZ Bridge to measure a player's progress within the game and to ensure that players at tournaments are playing at the right level.

At a club session you are awarded 'C' points. 100 'C' points = one 'B' point. Once you have amassed 5 'B' points, you are awarded a certificate of proficiency and your journey begins. 'B' points are also awarded to winners at Junior and Intermediate tournaments along with a cash prize. 'B' points cannot be converted to 'A' points. 'A' points are only awarded at 'A' point tournaments.

If you would like to know your grade, where you are in the ranking and how many points you have go the NZB webpage, dropdown masterpoints, click on the search masterpoints tab and put your name or NZB number in the boxes.
